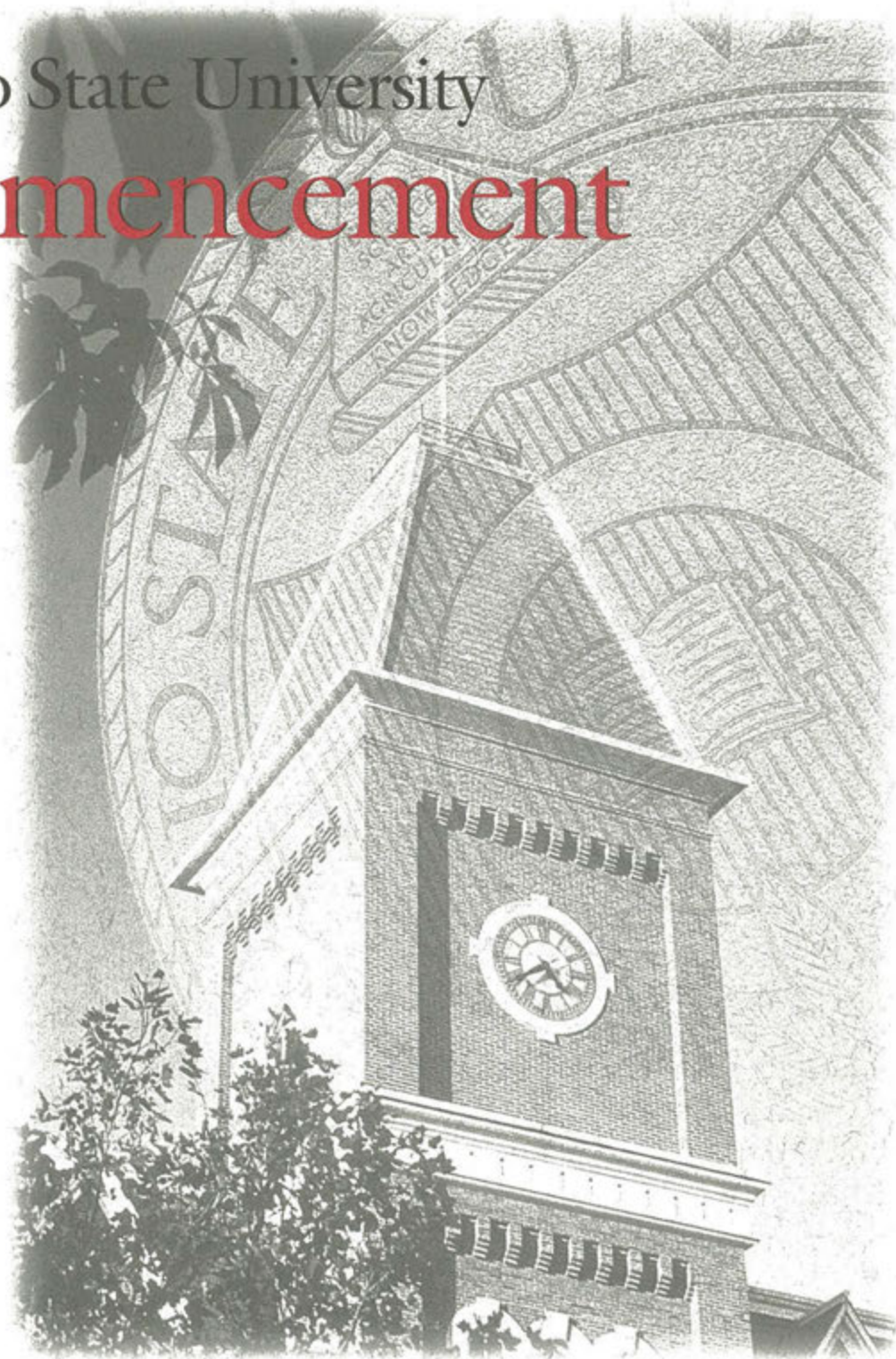

Richard D. Klausner, M.D.

Doctor of Science

Richard D. Klausner, M.D., has been director of the National Cancer Institute, a component of the National Institutes of Health, since August 1995.

Dr. Klausner began his service with the National Institutes of Health in 1979 as a research associate, becoming senior research investigator at the National Institute of Arthritis, Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases in 1983. In 1984, he was named chief of the Cell Biology and Metabolism Branch of the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, a post he held until 1997.

Recognized as one of the 20 most highly cited scientists in the world in the field of biology and biomedical research, Dr. Klausner has authored more than 280 scientific articles and several books.

His primary research interests include the molecular basis of iron metabolism in humans, the mechanisms of gene regulation, tumor suppressor genes, and receptor biology.

A native of New York, Dr. Klausner graduated *summa cum laude* from Yale University in 1973 with a Bachelor of Science in molecular biophysics and biochemistry. He received his M.D. from Duke University in 1976 and completed his medical training in internal medicine at Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard.

His work has been recognized with numerous honors and awards, including the Young Investigator Award from the American Federation of Clinical Research, the William Damashek Prize for Major Discoveries in Hematology, and the Distinguished Service Medal from the

U.S. Public Health Service. He was elected a member of the National Academy of Sciences in 1993 and chaired the Executive Editorial Committee of the Academy's National Committee on Science Education Standards and Assessment, the first comprehensive attempt to describe a vision of scientific literacy for all students in America.

In 1994, he served as president of the American Society for Clinical Investigation, and in 1995 he was elected a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. In constant demand as a speaker, he has held more than 70 distinguished lectureships throughout the country.

Ohio State welcomes Dr. Klausner to campus to address today's graduating class.

RECIPIENTS OF HONORS

Chung-Hsin Chung

Doctor of Science

Chung-Hsin Chung is retired Professor of Botany and Ecology and founder of the Institute of Spartina and Tidal Land Development at Nanjing University in China, where, for nearly 40 years, he taught and carried out research in salt marsh restoration, plant geography and physiology, and advanced ecology.

A native of Tianjin, China, Dr. Chung received a bachelor's degree from the University of Southern California in 1931, and a master's and doctorate in botany from Ohio State in 1932 and 1935 respectively. He returned to China in 1935 and taught plant biology and physiology at five major Chinese universities before joining the faculty of Nanjing in 1952. He remained a respected and productive teacher and

researcher, despite a lack of scientific resources, through the upheavals of World War II, the Chinese Revolution, and the Cultural Revolution, before retiring in 1991. He continues to publish his research in scholarly journals.

Widely recognized as the father of coastal restoration in China, Dr. Chung was responsible during the 1960s for planting hundreds of acres of China's ravaged eastern coastline with spartina, a salt marsh grass, reclaiming these wetlands for the production of food and fiber and protecting the mainland from typhoons and other natural disasters.

Dr. Chung has authored several widely distributed books and more than 100 scholarly papers. He began publishing his work in Western journals during the 1980s, and his work in wetlands

ecology is now internationally recognized. He has received a number of awards in China for his coastline restoration work, and in 1992, he was the first international person to be given the Honorary 100 Award by Ohio State's School of Natural Resources. In 1996, he was named an international fellow and lifetime member of the Society of Wetland Scientists.

Dr. Chung is recognized not only for his scientific accomplishments, but for his extensive knowledge of art, philosophy, and history, and he has remained an enthusiastic fan of Buckeye football since his student days.

Ohio State is privileged to have the opportunity to honor this distinguished teacher, researcher, and environmentalist.

Lee Yung Dug

Doctor of Education

Former Prime Minister of the Republic of Korea, Lee Yung Dug was a leader in the movement to reform secondary education in Korea. Now professor emeritus of education at Seoul National University, Dr. Lee has held a variety of important academic and administrative posts during his career.

After receiving an undergraduate degree in education from Seoul National University in 1952, Dr. Lee earned a master's and doctorate in education at Ohio State. He also spent a year of advanced study at the University of Chicago in 1965-66. He joined the education faculty at Seoul National University in 1959, remaining there until his 1991 retirement. During his 32 years as a professor of education, he played an important role in national educational policy as president of the Korean

Educational Development Institute and the Korean Society for the Study of Education and as a member of the Metropolitan Seoul Board of Education. Dr. Lee has authored five books on educational policy and curriculum and more than 50 articles.

From 1984 to 1991, Dr. Lee served as vice president of the Republic of Korea National Red Cross and was chief delegate to the South-North Red Cross Talk focusing on reunification. Following his retirement from Seoul National University, Dr. Lee became president of Myungji University for one year before being called upon by President KimYong-Sam to serve as deputy prime minister and minister of national unification. During 1994, he served as prime minister of the Republic of Korea.

Long active in promoting Korean internationalism and advancement, Dr.

Lee is currently chair of the National Council for the Promotion of Citizenship Education for the 2002 World Cup competition in Korea and Japan. In addition, he served as president of the Academy of Korean Studies from 1995-98 and as chair of the Korean National Council on Social Welfare during 1997-98. He has chaired the Korean Youth Counseling Institute since 1994 and is honorary president of Myungji University and chair of the board of trustees of Handong University.

For his exemplary public service, Dr. Lee has received civilian decorations from the government of the Republic of Korea and the Red Cross Order of Voluntary Service Merit in Gold.

Ohio State proudly recognizes this eminent alumnus, pioneering educator, and dedicated public servant.

RECIPIENTS OF HONORS

Eugene P. Odum

Doctor of Science

Eugene P. Odum is Callaway Professor Emeritus of Ecology, Alumni Foundation Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Zoology, and Director Emeritus of the Institute of Ecology at the University of Georgia in Athens.

His pioneering work in the field of ecosystem ecology has spanned many decades and is recognized throughout the international scientific community.

Dr. Odum received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of North Carolina in 1934 and 1936 and his doctorate from the University of Illinois in 1939. He joined the University of Georgia faculty as an instructor in the zoology department in 1940, becoming a full professor in 1954. From 1957 to 1961, he was instructor-in-charge of the Marine Ecology Summer Training

Program at the Marine Biological Laboratory in Woods Hole, Massachusetts.

He was named Alumni Foundation Distinguished Professor of Zoology at the University of Georgia in 1957 and became director of the university's Institute of Ecology in 1960. He was named Callaway Distinguished Professor of Ecology in 1977. During his tenure at the university, he was responsible for the establishment of the Marine Institute at Sapelo Island and the Savannah River Ecology Laboratory.

A prolific researcher and respected scholar, Dr. Odum is the author of *Fundamentals of Ecology*, *Ecology*, and *Basic Ecology*, three widely used textbooks that have been translated into numerous foreign languages, and he has written more than 200 scientific journal articles.

Among his many honors are the state of Georgia's Scientist of the Year Award (1968); the Prize of the Institute de la Vie, Paris (1975); the Ecological Society of America's Eminent Ecologist Award (1975); the Tyler Ecology Award (1977); the National Wildlife Federation's Educator of the Year Award (1977); the American Institute of Biological Sciences' Distinguished Service Award (1978); and the Royal Swedish Academy of Science's Crafoord Prize (1987). He is a member of the National Academy of Sciences and a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Ohio State proudly recognizes the many seminal contributions to the science of ecology made by this distinguished researcher.

RECIPIENTS OF HONORS

Vern R. Cahill

Distinguished Service Award

Vern R. Cahill was named professor emeritus of animal sciences in 1988 after a half-century of service in Ohio State's College of Agriculture (now Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences).

The Ohio native began his service to Ohio State working part-time in the Department of Animal Sciences' Meat Laboratory as an undergraduate. He received his Bachelor of Agricultural Sciences in animal science in 1941, followed by a master's and doctorate in meat science in 1942 and 1955 respectively. He worked as a graduate assistant from 1941 to 1942, and following service in the U.S. Army during World War II, returned to Ohio State as an instructor in animal sciences. In 1955, he was named assistant professor, becoming a full professor in 1961.

During his tenure at Ohio State, Dr. Cahill earned respect and recognition as both teacher and researcher. A popular advisor for undergraduate and graduate

students, he was especially active in working with international students and faculty with international interests. Following his retirement, he served as a Fulbright Senior Lecturer at the University of Campinas in Brazil in 1989. He has long been sought after for his expertise in the field of meat processing and has consulted throughout the world, including Taiwan, the Philippines, Thailand, the Dominican Republic, and Eastern Europe.

His research has included numerous projects sponsored through the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center dealing with the physical and chemical properties of meat and meat preservation. He is the author or co-author of more than 80 scientific articles as well as many popular articles related to meat and livestock.

His service to Ohio State includes membership on numerous university, college, and department committees, and he served as coordinator of meat

science programs from 1972 to 1986. For many years, he was faculty advisor to the Saddle and Sirloin Club, the Department of Animal Sciences' undergraduate student organization.

He continues to provide leadership for the College of Agriculture Alumni Society, which honored him with its Meritorious Service Award. His other honors include the American Meat Science Association's Distinguished Teaching Award, Signal Service Award, R.C. Pollock Award, the National Association of Meat Purveyors' Educators Award, and the American Society of Animal Science Fellow Award. Ohio State has honored him with the Alfred J. Wright Award for service to students as well as the College of Agriculture, Home Economics, and Natural Resources Outstanding Service to Students Award.

The university proudly adds its Distinguished Service Award to the many deservedly held by this valued teacher and member of the university community.

Gay B. Hadley

Distinguished Service Award

Gay B. Hadley retired from Ohio State in 1995 after 13 years of exemplary service in both administrative and academic positions. At the time of her retirement, she was assistant vice president in the Office of Human Resources.

Dr. Hadley received a B.A. in American history from Western College for Women in 1952 and, after raising her family, came to Ohio State where she earned an interdisciplinary master's degree in education, psychology, and comparative literature in 1976. That same year, she founded OPTIONS, Inc., a community-based educational and career counseling agency for adults, and served as its director until 1981. In 1982, she received her doctorate in education from Ohio State, joining the faculty as an adjunct assistant professor in the Department of Educational Policy and Leadership and serving as associate director of the Department of Credit

Programs in the Office of Continuing Education.

In 1986, she was named associate executive officer for career development in the Office of Human Relations and, from 1991 to 1992, she served as acting associate vice president for human relations. In 1992, she was named assistant vice president of human resources.

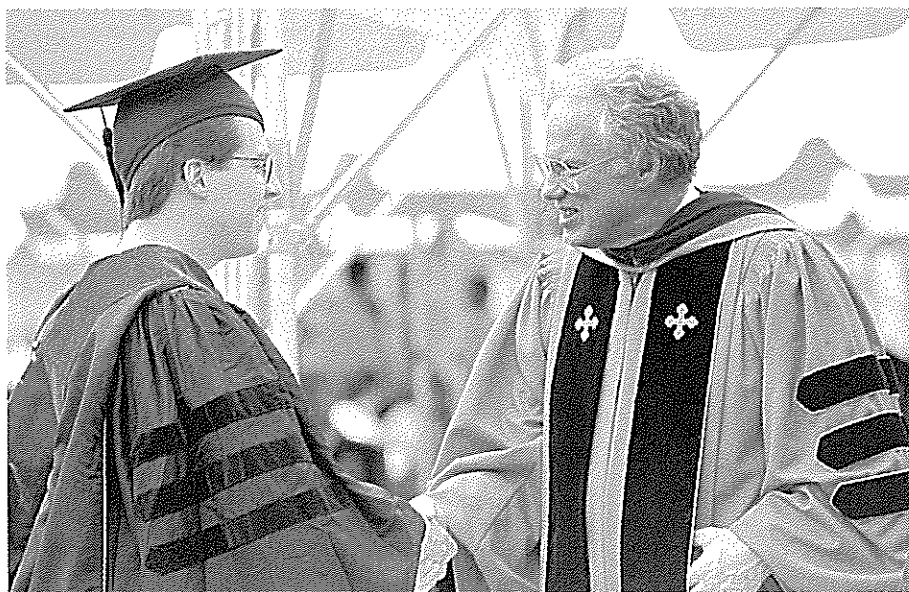
During her tenure at Ohio State, Dr. Hadley worked tirelessly to raise the status of women, minorities, and non-traditional students. She developed the first orientation program at Ohio State for women re-entering higher education, and she played a leadership role in establishing the Critical Difference for Women program, which offers financial support and career enhancement programs to women working on graduate or professional degrees. Dr. Hadley also created and implemented the Office of Continuing

Education's BRIDGE Program to provide academic and counseling support to university staff members pursuing a college degree and the Career Development Office for faculty and staff, which has become a national model.

She served from 1986 to 1989 as co-chair of the highly successful Campus Campaign, the first development effort geared toward encouraging faculty and staff support of university initiatives. In 1992, Ohio State honored her and her campaign colleagues with its Everett D. Reese Medal for exceptional service in private philanthropy. Her expertise in fund raising also earned the Campus Campaign a Gold Medal Award for special constituency giving from the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education in 1987.

It is with gratitude that Ohio State recognizes the creativity and commitment of this remarkable advocate for higher education.

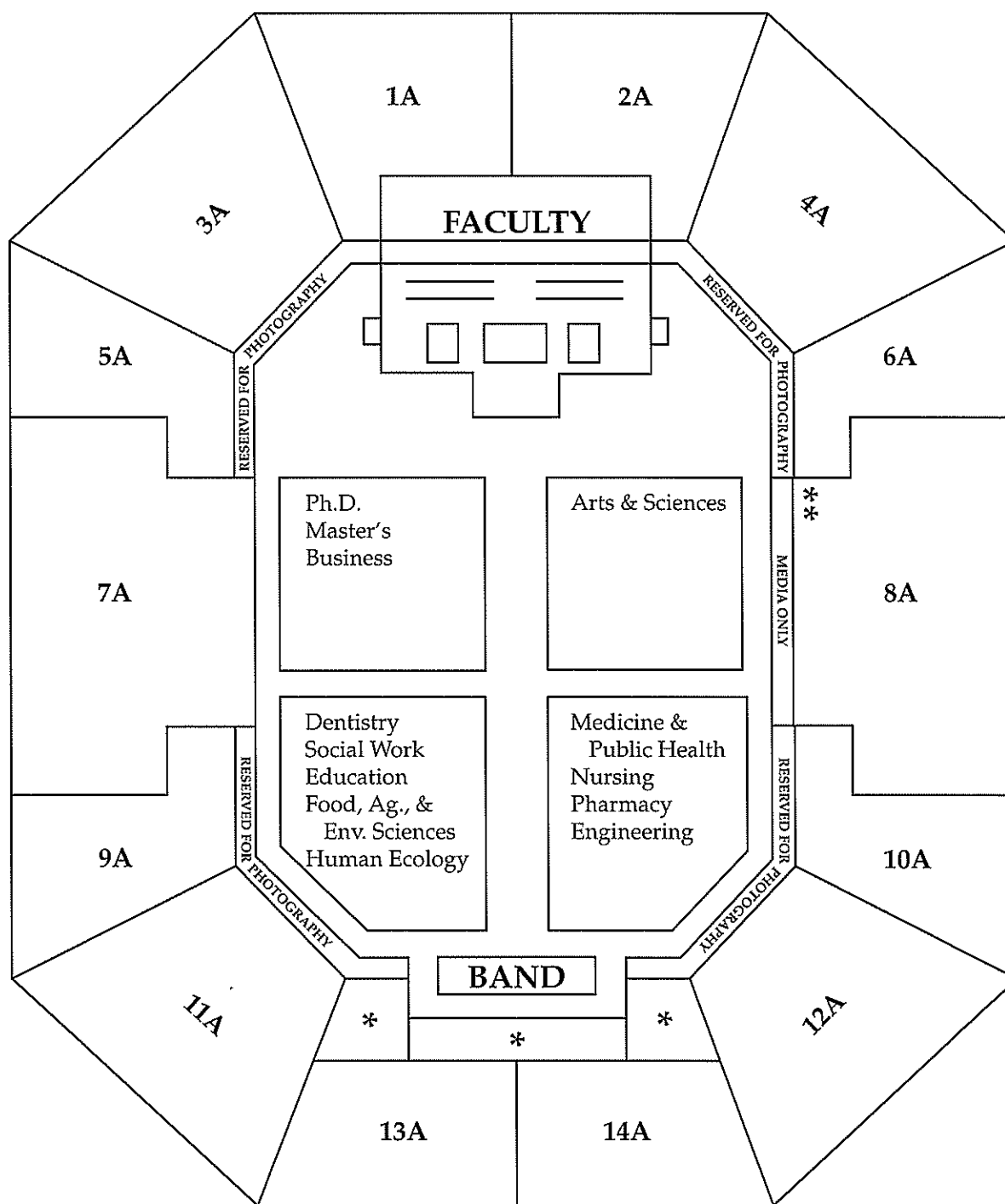

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The colorful ceremonies of The Ohio State University Commencements derive from practices originating in the Middle Ages. When European universities were taking form in the 12th and 13th centuries, the scholars were usually clerics, and consequently they adopted costumes similar to those of their monastic orders. Cold halls and drafty buildings called for caps and floor-length capes with attached hoods, and the sobering influence of the church probably influenced the staid character of the caps and gowns.

As the control of the universities gradually passed from the church, some

aspects of the costumes took on brighter hues. Old prints and engravings, however, reveal a strong similarity between the regalia worn in early universities and that of the present day.

In the light of our nation's English heritage, academic costume has been in use in the United States since colonial times. To establish a standard of uniformity in regard to the practice, an intercollegiate commission was formed to prepare a code for caps, gowns, and hoods that has since been adopted by all academic institutions.

Originally round, the shape of the cap is now the familiar mortarboard

square—a shape which, according to ballad folklore, resembles a scholar's book. Legend also has it that the privilege of wearing a cap was the initial right of a freed Roman slave; the academic cap, therefore, has become a sign of the freedom of scholarship. The flowing gown has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it covers any dress that might indicate rank or social status. The hood, reserved at The Ohio State University for those receiving doctoral degrees, not only indicates the type of degree, but also is lined with the official colors of the university.

The Gown

Bachelor: Black, full cut with long pointed sleeves.

Master: Black, long or short sleeves with a reshaped panel extended for each sleeve.

Doctor: Black with velvet panels on front of gown and three velvet bars on each sleeve. Color of the velvet may be black or distinctive of the field of study.

Honors Emblem

The Ohio State University honors emblem is a scarlet and gray tasseled braid worn over the gown. Students eligible for this curricular honor are those graduating *summa cum laude*, *magna cum laude*, *cum laude*, with distinction, with honors in the liberal arts, and with honors in pharmacy.

The Hood

Bachelor: Three feet long with a two-inch-wide velvet edging.*

Master: Three and one-half feet long with a three-inch-wide velvet edging.*

Doctor: Four feet in length with a five-inch-wide velvet edging and panel at the sides.

The lining of all hoods, which is folded out, bears the official colors of the institution granting the degree. The color of the velvet indicates the field of study:
