Summer 2025 Term**5104 Fundamentals of Court Interpreting - Advanced Language Institute****U G 3**

Advanced Spanish level students will learn and practice the foundational aspects of the profession of court interpreting, with special emphasis on its core ethical principles, protocols, terminology, and skills, as well as the professional identity and role of the court interpreter. This course is designed to produce certifiable Spanish-English/English-Spanish court interpreters. Students learn how to interact effectively in French with patients and patients' families from various cultural backgrounds, and/or to practice their profession in a Francophone context, at a mid- to high-intermediate level of French.

Prereq: French 2101.01 or 2101.61.

Advanced course in Military History. Topics Vary.

Prereq or concur: Any 3000-level History course, and English 1110.xx; or Grad standing; or permission of instructor. Repeatable to a maximum of 12 cr hrs.

Korean**KOREAN****Autumn 2025 Semester****5453 Readings in Korean Literary and Classical Texts****U G 3**

Advanced study of Korean language and literature in cross-cultural context, by introducing selected narrative, drama, poetry, and critical essays in Korean. Includes literary translation.

Prereq: Completion of Level Three Korean, or permission of instructor. Repeatable to a maximum of 6 cr hrs.

Political Science**POLITSC****Autumn 2025 Semester****7330 International Organization: Global Governance****G 3**

Examination of global governance in such terms as changing political, legal, and normative contexts; security, economic, and environmental issues; state and non-state actors; and tools such as force, discipline, and law.

Prereq: Not open to students with credit for 760.

Update Course**Agricultural, Environmental, and Dev Economics****AEDECON****Autumn 2025 Semester****4567 Assessing Sustainability: Project Experience****U 3**

Students gain experience in sustainability assessment by applying concepts and quantitative methods to evaluate environmental, economic, social & technical sustainability of specific projects. EEDS major capstone. Co-taught by ENR/AEDE faculty.

Prereq: 2500, or 2501/2501E, or ENR 2500 or 2501/2501E, and Sr standing; or permission of instructor. Not open to students with credit for ENR 4567. Cross-listed in ENR.

Animal Sciences**ANIMSCI****Summer 2025 Term****3797.07 Dairy Industry Outside the U.S.****U 3**

Increase the understanding of undergraduate students to the global nature of the dairy industry, comparing the demographics, cultural and economic forces, and natural resource availability on dairy farming and milk processing in a global setting. Admission to the Dairy Industry Outside of the U.S. education abroad program required.

Prereq: 2400.07 and permission of instructor.

History of architecture from ancient to contemporary: historical inquiry, physical and cultural influences, theories, and analytical techniques.
Prereq: Honors standing.

Summer 2025 Term**6710 Integrated Architectural Structures****G 3**

Statics, strength of materials, and structural systems: principles, elements, systems.
Prereq: Grad standing.

Arts and Sciences**ARTSSCI****Spring 2025 Semester****1411 Information Formats****U 1****Campus: COL MNS**

This course gives students an overview of the variety of information formats that are available and how they are used in different disciplines. After an overview of research in broad disciplines, students will examine different information formats from different disciplines to gain a better understanding of these formats' elements, how those resources are used, and their importance to disciplines.

Astronomy**ASTRON****Autumn 2025 Semester****3350 Methods of Astronomical Observation and Data Analysis****U 4**

Overview of observational methods and quantitative analysis in astronomy with applications to the large datasets produced by modern astronomy surveys. Students will apply commonly used methods to reproduce major astronomical results in a collaborative setting. The course prepares students for advanced undergraduate research in astronomy and introduces broadly-applicable data analysis tools. Previous coursework or experience with statistical analysis and linear algebra are useful but not required.

Business Admin: Marketing & Logistics**BUSML****Summer 2025 Term****4383 Supply Chain Management****U 1½**

Focuses on distinction between logistics and supply chain management; cross-functional integration of key business processes within the firm and across network of firms that comprise supply-chain; framework for supply chain management.

Prereq: 3380, and AcctMIS 2200, 2300, and BusMgt 2320, 2321; and BusMHR 2291; and permission of instructor.

Chemistry**CHEM****Summer 2025 Term****2550 Organic Chemistry Laboratory II****U 2**

Synthetic application to various organic reaction and spectroscopic characterization, scientific writing, computational chemistry, and the laboratory techniques of organic chemistry. The course includes application of synthesis, isolation, purification, and identification of organic compounds. Continued discussion of techniques and problem solving related to spectroscopy.

Prereq or concur: 2520, 2620 or 2920H; and 1208, 1210, 1250, 1610 or 1910H; and 1220, 1620 or 1920H; and 2510, 2610 or 2910H; and 2540; and Math Placement Level L or M or a grade of C- or above in Math 1120, 1130, 1131, 1148, 1150 or above.

Not open to students with credit for 3900, 3905, 4900, 4900H, 4901, or Engr 5901.01. This course is progress graded.

Spring 2025 Semester**8896.21 EEOB Graduate Seminar: The Culture of Science****G 1 - 2**

Current topics in diversity, equity and inclusion in science, with a focus on evolution, ecology and organismal biology.

Prereq: Grad standing, or permission of instructor. Repeatable to a maximum of 20 cr hrs or 10 completions. This course is graded S/U.

Environment and Natural Resources**ENR****Autumn 2025 Semester****4567 Assessing Sustainability: Project Experience****U 3**

Students gain experience in sustainability assessment by applying concepts and quantitative methods to evaluate environmental, economic, social, & technical sustainability of specific projects. EEDS major capstone. Co-taught by ENR/AEDE faculty.

Prereq: 2500, or 2501/2501E, or AEDEcon 2500 or 2501/2501E; and Sr standing; or permission of instructor. Not open to students with credit for AEDEcon 4567. Cross-listed in AEDEcon.

Autumn 2025 Semester**5362 Wildlife Ecology Methods****U G 3**

Methods used by wildlife ecologists to measure population characteristics and habitat quality for wild terrestrial vertebrates.

Prereq: 3300; and 2000, or Stat 1450.xx or 2450.xx; or Grad standing.

Greek**GREEK****Autumn 2025 Semester****6891 Greek Survey I****G 4**

Survey of Greek literature (I).

Prereq: Two (2) 2000-level Greek courses; or grad standing in Classics; or permission of instructor.

History**HISTORY****Summer 2025 Term****2453 History of Zionism and Modern Israel****U 3**

A history of the Jewish state from the rise of Zionism to the present, with a focus on migration and displacement. Topics include: Jewish-Arab relations, the encounter between European and Middle Eastern Jews, the creation of a new Hebrew identity, the impact of the Holocaust, ethnic conflict and social protest, war and diplomacy, religion and the state and struggles over the nature of the regime.

Prereq: Not open to students with credit for JewshSt 2453. GE historical study course. GE theme migration, mobility, and immobility course. Cross-listed in JewshSt.

Japanese**JAPANSE****Summer 2025 Term****1102.51 Level One Japanese II: Individualized Track****U 1 - 4**

Continuation of 1101.01, 1101.02, or 4 credits of 1101.51. Individualized. Students complete from 1 to 4 units during the semester. Progress is sequential from one unit to the next with proficiency at the level of 80% required for advancement.

Prereq: 1101.01 or 1101.02 or 4 units of 1101.51. Advancement to the first credit in this course in the same semester as the completion of the 4th credit for 1101.51 requires registration for both courses, with permission of instructor. Not open to students with credit for 1102.01, 1102.02, or 4 credits of 1102.51; or to native speakers of this language through regular course enrollment or EM credits. Repeatable to a maximum of 4 cr hrs or 4 completions. This course is available for EM credit. GE for lang course. GE world languages course.

Summer 2025 Term**2453 History of Zionism and Modern Israel****U 3**

A history of the Jewish state from the rise of Zionism to the present, with a focus on migration and displacement. Landscape Architecture**LARCH****Autumn 2025 Semester****3940 Design Studio IV: Landscape Ecology & Planning****U 6**

Synthesis of landscape ecology and urban ecology principles with landscape planning and design at the district, watershed and/or regional scale, with a focus on integration of advanced inventory and analysis methodologies.

Prereq: 2930, 3430, 3440, and 2367; or with permission from the LARCH UG Chair.

Latin**LATIN****Autumn 2025 Semester****6891 Latin Survey I****G 4**

Survey of Latin literature (I).

Prereq: Two (2) 2000-level Latin courses; or grad standing in Classics; or permission of instructor.

Materials Science and Engineering**MATSCEN****Autumn 2025 Semester****4381.01 Design and Professional Practice I****U 3**

An in-depth design project to foster independent thinking and to develop problem-solving skills. Design of experiments, applied statistics, presentation and communication skills will be discussed.

Prereq: 3141, 3151, and 3331; and GenEd 1201 or 2601. Prereq or concur: 3261, 3271 or 3332, and enrollment as MatScEn-BS major; or permission of instructor.

Mechanical Engineering**MECHENG****Summer 2025 Term****4998 Undergraduate Research in Mechanical Engineering****U 1 - 2**

Campus: COL MRN

Opportunity for undergraduate students to conduct research in Mechanical Engineering.

Prereq: Permission of instructor. Repeatable to a maximum of 6 cr hrs or 6 completions. This course is graded S/U.

Public Health: Biostatistics**PUBHBIO**

Summer 2025 Term**7235 Applied Survival Analysis****G 3**

Introduction to time-to-event data analysis. Topics include summary statistics, non-parametric methods, semiparametric and parametric models, and competing risks analysis. Focus is on analysis of health data using statistical software.

Prereq: 6211, or Stat 6450 or 6950; or permission of instructor. Not open to students with credit for Stat 6605.

Cross-listed in Stat 6605.

Public Health: Epidemiology**PUBHEPI****Summer 2025 Term****4410 Conceptual Foundations of Social Epidemiology****U 3**

This course focuses on how social factors, such as education, neighborhood context, & structural & institutional racism are related to various population health outcomes. Students will learn theories that inform how social determinants of health are measured, & how epidemiologists use these measures to identify determinants of disease & ill health among populations, especially marginalized groups.

Prereq: 2410; or permission of instructor.

Summer 2025 Term**6442 Methods in Social Epidemiology****G 3**

Social and structural contributors to the distribution of health and disease in populations with emphasis on measurement and methodological challenges.

Prereq: 4410, 6410, 6430, or PubHlth 6001; and Grad standing; or permission of instructor.

Withdraw Course**Pharmacy****PHR****Autumn 2025 Semester****7351 Special Topics in Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy****G 2**

This course provides advanced training in specialized topics in medicinal chemistry relevant to research interests in the field. The course will enhance students' problem-solving skills, and students will develop grant writing skills related to research topics in medicinal chemistry.

Prereq: 7350, or permission of instructor. Not open to students with credit for 8350, 8360, or 8370.
